Nigerian national dies under mysterious circumstances

A 32-year-old Nigerian national died under mysterious circumstances after being apprehended by the Special Staff of the West district during an operation "Kavach" in West Delhi, police said on Monday. Delhi Police, in a statement, said that the incident took place on the evening of Sunday as part of an ongoing drive "Operation Kavach", aimed at intensified patrolling in busy areas and along major roads to check suspicious activities. "The Special Staff was on routine patrol when they spotted a man riding a black scooter on the wrong side of the road near Rajouri Garden

Metro station. Finding his movement suspicious, the team signalled him to stop for questioning," Deputy Commissioner of Police (West) Darade Sharad Bhaskar in the statement said. However, instead of halting, the rider rammed his scooter into a police motorcycle and fell on the road. He then abandoned the vehicle and attempted to flee, prompting the police team to chase and apprehend him after a brief pursuit, read the statement.

The suspect was subsequently taken to the Special Staff office located near Tagore Garden for further questioning. During interaction, the man did not cooperate with the police and complained of uneasiness, it read.



Sensing his deteriorating condition, the police team immediately shifted him to Guru Gobind Singh Hospital in Khyala for medical examination. However, doctors at the hospital declared him "brought dead", as per the medical reports. The deceased has been identified as Christian Eze Promise, a Nigerian national. His body has been preserved at the mortuary of AIIMS in New Delhi for further legal formalities, including a postmortem. Police said due procedure has been followed in the case, and intimation

regarding the incident has been sent to the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC), the Ministry of External Affairs, and the High Commission of Nigeria, in accordance with standing guidelines issued by the Police Headquarters (PHQ) in cases involving foreign nationals. Police added that all mandatory protocols are being adhered to, and documentation related to the case has been completed as per norms. Meanwhile, a police officer said, "We have stepped up security outside the police station to maintain law and order."

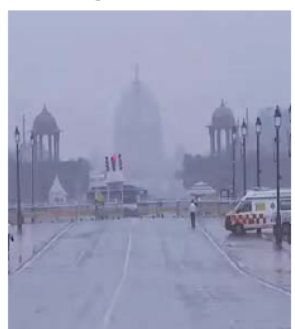
With the death occurring under unclear circumstances, police sources said a parallel inquiry is also being conducted to ascertain whether it qualifies as a case of custodial death. A team of senior officers has been tasked with conducting a thorough probe into the sequence of events. Investigators will examine CCTV footage covering the entire chain of events — from the location where the suspect was first spotted and apprehended near Rajouri Garden to his movement towards the Special Staff office and subsequent visit to the hospital — to establish the exact circumstances leading to his death. Further legal action will be taken based on the findings of the inquiry and post-mortem report, police sources added.

RAIN, GUSTY WINDS BRING RELIEF TO DELHI AFTER HOT DAY

Delhi witnessed rain and strong winds of up to 56 kmph on Monday evening, bringing relief after a warm and humid day, even as the India Meteorological Department (IMD) issued an orange alert for the national Capital.

The sudden weather change disrupted the afternoon heat, with rainfall recorded across multiple stations between 2:30 pm and 5:30 pm. According to data, Mayur Vihar recorded the highest rainfall at 1 mm, followed by Lodi Road at 0.7



mm, Ayanagar at 0.6 mm, and Safdarjung, Pusa, and Janakpuri at 0.5 mm each. Palam and Ridge recorded 0.2 mm of rainfall.

However, most parts of the city saw little to no rainfall earlier in the day. Between 8:30 am and 2:30 pm, only traces of very light rain were recorded at a few locations. Strong winds accompanied the showers in the late afternoon.

CM Rekha attends mass marriage ceremony

Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Monday attended a grand mass marriage ceremony at Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, where 51 couples were married in a State-supported initiative aimed at promoting dignity, equality, and social support for women.

The event, attended by several prominent dignitaries, focused on supporting brides from economically weaker sections with financial aid, education tools, and long-term welfare measures. "This is not merely a wedding, but a celebration of the dignity and empowerment of daughters," the CM said.

She said the initiative goes beyond solemnising marriages and reflects a broader commitment to social equality and inclusion. "This is a strong step towards ensuring a safe, dignified, and self-reliant future for daughters," she added.

The ceremony was held in the presence of spiritual leader Swami Avdhesanand Giri of the Juna Akhara.

Former President Ram Nath Kovind, his wife Savita Kovind, and Union Minister of State for Youth Affairs and Sports Raksha Khadse were also present.

Officials said each bride was provided with a comprehensive support package to help her begin married life with financial stability and independence. This included direct financial assistance of ₹1 lakh.

In addition, after marriage, each bride will receive skill development and training worth up to ₹1 lakh to improve employment opportunities. To encourage education, each bride was given a laptop and e-learning material. Healthcare support was also included in the package. Each bride has been covered under a health insurance scheme of up to ₹7.5 lakh for a period of three years. The premium for the scheme will be borne by the organising institution.

The Chief Minister reiterated that the Delhi Government will continue to support such initiatives that promote inclusivity and respect for women.

LG reviews Bhalswa landfill

Delhi Lieutenant Governor Taranjit Singh Sandhu visited the Bhalswa landfill site on Monday to review the progress of ongoing bioremediation efforts and said that while work has picked up in recent years, more needs to be done.

According to a post on X, LG's official handle posted that the visit comes in the backdrop of Prime Minister Narendra Modi earlier flagging the three major garbage dump sites in the city, namely Bhalswa, Ghazipur and Okhla as "mountains of garbage" and calling for their removal, following which work began in 2022. "While significant

He advised officials to explore emerging global technologies in waste management, along with international benchmarks and expert consultation, to speed up the work.

Delhi Government releases ₹20.26 cr for cow welfare

The Delhi Government has released ₹20.26 crore to support cow welfare and strengthen *gaushalas* infrastructure. The Chief Minister, Rekha Gupta, made an announcement on Monday and outlined a plan to develop 10 modern *gaushalas* in the first phase.

The funds aim to clear pending dues, ensure regular fodder supply, and improve facilities for stray cattle across the Capital. Lease extensions and licences for existing *gaushalas* have also been renewed to ensure uninterrupted operations. "Our Government is fully committed to the protection and welfare of stray cattle. *Gaushalas* must function without financial or administrative hurdles," the Chief Minister said while addressing an event at the Jan Seva Sadan.

The financial package includes ₹7.64 crore to clear pending liabilities from June 2024 to March 2025 and ₹12.62 crore towards fodder expenses from April 2025 to January 2026. Officials said the move will help ensure timely feeding, shelter, and medical care for cattle housed in these facilities.

The Chief Minister also handed over lease extension certificates and official documents to representatives of four Government-supported *gaushalas* located in Sultanpur Dabas, Rewla Khanpur, Harewali, and Surhara. These *gaushalas* operate under the Animal Husbandry Unit and cater to stray cattle brought in by local civic bodies.

The Chief Minister said the Government plans to transform *gaushalas* into modern, well-equipped centres for animal care. "In the first phase, 10 modern *gaushalas* will be developed. Our goal is to eventually equip around 40 *gaushalas* with improved infrastructure and services," she said. The initiative also includes

financial assistance for setting up biogas plants at *gaushalas*. Officials said this will help convert cow dung into clean energy, promoting sustainability and better sanitation. The Chief Minister stressed that *gaushalas* should not be seen merely as shelters but as centres of compassion and service. She said protecting stray animals, especially abandoned cows, and is essential in a large urban centre like Delhi. "*Gaushalas* provide not just shelter but also nutrition and medical care to animals that cannot fend for themselves. It is our responsibility to ensure they live with dignity," she said.

The Chief Minister added that clearing long-pending dues and renewing licenses reflects the Government's intent to remove bottlenecks faced by *gaushala* managements. She said authorities want operators to focus entirely on animal welfare without worrying about funding or regulatory delays.

Officials said the Government will also work with *gaushala* managements to introduce better fodder management systems and modern veterinary services. The focus will be on improving overall efficiency and ensuring higher standards of care.

The Chief Minister noted that long-term success will require cooperation between the Government and society. She said public participation and awareness are key to addressing the issue of stray cattle in the city.

Representatives of the *gaushalas* present at the event welcomed the move and expressed gratitude for the financial support. They said the funds and policy decisions will help improve facilities and ensure better care for animals.

The initiative is part of a broader effort by the Delhi Government to address stray cattle issues while promoting animal welfare and sustainable practices.
